Revisions to Section 10-11-7, Supplemental Regulations for Sawmills, to also include Commercial Firewood Processors as noted in red below:

- 10-11-7. Sawmills and Commercial Firewood Processors
- 10-11-7.1. Sawmills, <u>Commercial Firewood Processors</u> and related uses shall be setback 300 feet from all parcel boundaries.
- 10-11-7.2. Sawmills <u>and Commercial Firewood Processors</u> must have direct access to a state-maintained public road.
- 10-11-7.3. Hours of operation for a-sawmills and commercial firewood processors shall be limited to 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on weekdays and 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on weekdays and 9:00 a.m. to
- 10-11-7.4. No sawdust, slabs or shavings shall be deposited any closer than 200 feet of any public road and sawdust or wood chip piles shall not exceed 25 feet in height.
- 10-11-7.5. The site shall be screened to ensure a minimal visual impact on adjacent uses, including but not limited to, fencing, preservation of existing vegetation, and additional vegetation.

## Addition to Article 12. Definitions:

Commercial Firewood Processor - An operation used for the purpose of processing felled trees and timber delivered from off-site locations into firewood with the intent to sell to others. Operations may include cutting, splitting, drying and bundling of wood and may include pertinent delivery, loading, processing and storage areas for raw materials and/or finished wood products. This definition shall not include the processing of trees into firewood on the lot or parcel where they were grown.
